PENTECOST SUNDAY (YEAR C) - 09 JUNE 2019

Today is the feast of Pentecost. Fifty days after Passover, the Israelites celebrated a harvest festival. Fifty days after Easter - the new Passover - we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the church's mission - a different kind of harvest in which all those who hear and respond to the word of God are gathered together. Our whole lives are to become an offering to the Lord. Just as the effects of the Holy Spirit were visible in the first disciples, so our faith should make a visible difference in our lives and draw others to the same source of new life.

What difference should other people be able to see in us? Last week, I listed the traditional 'fruits' of the Holy Spirit - signs that we are indeed open to his gifts and are allowing him to work in and through us. Those fruits, once again, are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Two of these fruits are mentioned in today's gospel, in which we are taken back to the Upper Room, and the appearance of Our Lord on the day of resurrection. As the risen Lord gives the apostles an advance gift of the Holy Spirit - anticipating what they were to receive in that same room fifty days later - Jesus speaks of peace and joy.

The peace that comes from the Holy Spirit dwelling within us is not merely an absence of conflict, but that order and well-being that comes from a life totally aligned to God. We experience his peace when we choose his will over our own, for his will is for our perfect good. This peace leads to joy, for God as a good father wants us to be totally happy. A life lived in friendship with God brings with it lasting joy that is not dependent on good fortune or material well-being. There are no miserable saints, even though it is true that all the saints have shared Christ's suffering in some way. Whatever life brings, there is a deep joy

that comes from knowing that “when all is said and done, we are infinitely loved” (Pope Francis, The Joy of the Gospel).

On this day of Pentecost, seven young people of our parish will receive a new gift of the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of confirmation. In this sacrament it is God, not us, doing the ‘confirming’ - the gifts of the Holy Spirit are given to make us firm, to strengthen us and equip us for our part in the mission of the church. May all of us, and especially these newly confirmed young people, be always strong in faith; faith which is visible and bears fruit in our lives and enables us to endure all things for the sake of Christ and the eternal life he promises.
